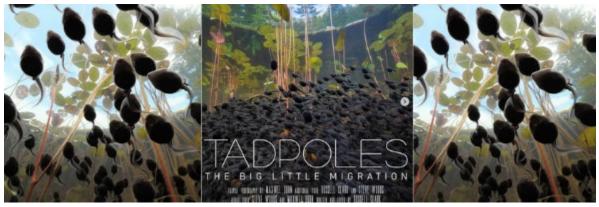
Winter Garden Seedlings

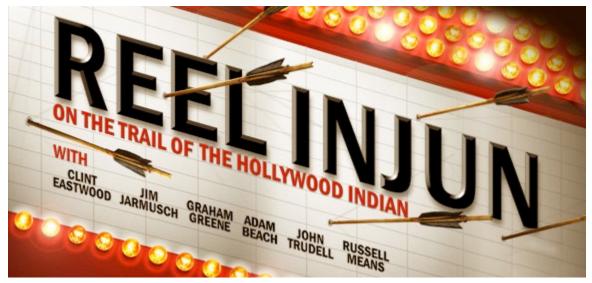
Nature Film Shot on Vancouver Island

This short documentary is a beautiful watch for all ages & shot here in <u>#BC</u> over a four year period. "<u>Tadpoles: The Big Little Migration</u>", from underwater cinematographer & photographer Maxwel Hohn (who lives in Courtney, BC), has won many many (well-deserved) awards.

TRC Booklets

Calls to Action Booklets from the National Centre for Truth and Reconciliation. "In this booklet, you will find the TRC's 10 principles of Reconciliation, the 94 calls to action and the 46 articles of the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples (UNDRIP). These documents are instruments of Reconciliation that should be read and considered together.

The first principle of Reconciliation confirms that UNDRIP is the framework for Reconciliation for all sectors of Canadian society. The other nine principles serve as guides to assist in repairing the damaged relationship between Indigenous and non-Indigenous Peoples in Canada." - <u>National Centre for Truth and Reconciliation</u>.



Reel Injun Documentary

The data we consume shapes how we view the world. Let's try to decolonize our minds a little with some historical content of the misrepresentation Indigenous folks in the movies. This great documentary featuring Graham Greene, Adam Beach, Clint Eastwood, Jim Jarmusch, Robbie Robertson, Zacharias Kunuk and others appear in this insightful and incisive history of First Peoples' representation on screen. Reel Injun seeks to redress the stereotypes and misconceptions created by a century's worth of often ignorant, sometimes malicious depictions of North America's Indigenous peoples. Featuring clips from hundreds of classic and contemporary films and interviews with both Native and non-Native artists and activists — including actors Graham Greene and Adam Beach, directors Zacharias Kunuk, Chris Eyre, Jim Jarmusch and Clint Eastwood, and musicians Robbie Robertson and John Trudell — Reel Injun is a vital corrective to a skewed film history.

BC Accessibility Act

The Accessible British Columbia Act received Royal Assent on June 17, 2021, and is now law. This act serves to ensure that BC residents of all abilities will have full access to information and resources in accessible formats. <u>View a plain language overview of the Accessible B.C. Act</u>. The BC government offers an <u>Accessible Toolkit</u> to help folks learn to make more accessible work product and understand the options that are already available and/or easy to access.
